

Janie Bryant (janiebryant .com) made her first dress when she was just eight years old—an early indicator of her future career in costume design. Growing up in Cleveland, Tennessee, she was influenced by countless classic movies ranging from Guys and Dolls to Gone with the Wind to Grease to The Wizard of Oz. (Moulin Rouge and The Duchess are more recent favorites.)

In 1999, Janie—who studied fashion design and costume history—relocated from New York City to Los Angeles to immerse herself in the film industry. Today, her credits include Deadwood, The Last House on the Left, Simply Irresistible, Mr. Jealousy, and Palookaville. But she may be best known for her work on AMC's Mad Men. "There is never a dull moment," she says of her job. "I love working with my team and creating characters through costume design."

At the end of her workdays, she unwinds in the *Mediterranean-style home* that she shares with husband Peter Yozell. "My home is all about creating a marriage of the *Rococo* and *Palm Springs*! Dramatic pieces include a white shag carpet in the master bedroom, chandeliers from a Milanese palace, peacock feathers, and a fabulous tiger-striped sofa," says Janie, who collaborated with interior designer Meredith Kleinman on the decor. The pair turned a bedroom into a closet for Janie's enviable wardrobe. "It's a dream come true," she says. We wouldn't expect anything less.

working on 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue in New York for a fashion designer when I met a costume designer at a party. Her job fascinated me because she got to combine her love for design with a love for film. I grew up watching movies, especially the classics, and was obsessed with the costumes I saw. I knew this was a career move I wanted to make, so I began taking any costume design job I could, building my resume with each project.

DAY IN THE LIFE: No two days are ever the same for a costume designer. I split my time between reading scripts for the upcoming episodes, designing new costumes, redesigning vintage pieces for the show, swatching fabric, finding vintage pieces for the characters, getting our costume line set for each day's shooting schedule, taking meetings, doing research, fitting the actors, working with my crew, and so many other things! [For research], I use vintage catalogs, magazines, movies, photos, newspaper clippings, and the Internet to get a sense of what was authentic to the period.

# FAVORITE FASHION ERA:

French Rococo. It's all about the opulence and extravagance for both men and women. Think of Madame de Pompadour and of Marie Antoinette. Women wore panniers, corsets, plunging necklines, and pagoda sleeves adorned with lace and ribbons.
